

## USAA Poppy Exhibit Open at USS Lexington Museum to Remember Fallen Military

Temporary installation of exhibit raises awareness about true meaning of Memorial Day; free and discounted admission available for military, USAA members and employees

WHAT: A special version of USAA's Poppy Wall of Honor will open as a temporary exhibit at the USS Lexington Museum in time for our nation's Memorial Day observance. A second, temporary Poppy Exhibit will be located at the Military Aviation Museum in Virginia Beach, VA.

> Visitors to the Poppy Exhibit will have the opportunity to learn more about the true meaning of Memorial Day, the poppy flower as an international symbol of remembrance, and conflicts since WWI. The seven feet by seven feet exhibit will also provide an interactive display to encourage visitors to pause and reflect on the more than 645,000 military service members who gave their lives in combat in service to our country.



The Poppy Exhibit at the USS Lexington Museum will be open to the public starting on Friday, May 19, through Wednesday, June 7.

Military ID Holders (active, reserve, or retired), USAA members and USAA employees can receive FREE admission to the museum from May 26 - May 29 with a valid form of identification. After Memorial Day weekend, USAA is offering those eligible a 50% discount on ticket admission price to the museum, while supplies last or until June 7, whichever occurs first.

To be eligible, guests must show a valid Military ID, USAA card, USAA Member ID, USAA proof of insurance, USAA mobile app, or USAA employee ID. Offer is limited to one free/discounted entry per verified identification.
